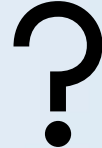


Multi-Factor Authentication



What is it

- Multi-factor authentication (MFA) is a security method that requires users to verify their identity in more than one way before gaining access to an account or system. Instead of relying only on a password, MFA combines two or more factors, such as:
- **Something you know** (a password)
- **Something you have** (an authenticator app)



Why do I care

- Multi-factor authentication adds a strong layer of security by requiring not just your password but also a code from an authenticator app.
- Even if someone steals your password, they can't access your account without that extra verification



Where can it be used

- Students can turn it on in "my profile"
- Staff can set it for themselves inside enrolle

Conditional Logic

In the Profile Manager, each property you decide to include can now have conditions. Conditions contain:

1. The field being checked
2. The type of comparison being made (contains, less than, is before, etc.)
3. The value it's being compared to (either a literal value or the value of a different property)

On the Shopping Cart, the Add Attendee page will then dynamically target what you information you need while hiding these properties until the condition has been met.




Example use case:

You want to ask if student is a US Citizen.


Based on their answer to that question you would then prompt for other user-defined fields such as citizenship country.





Fee waiver approvals (colleague connector) entrinsic

- 1  Mark course with COLLEAGUE.APPROVAL UDF
Orders will have COLLEAGUE.APPROVED UDF
- 2  Review report of orders that are not yet approved for courses that require approval
- 3  Once order is approved, it flows to colleague
Student sees “pending” status until it is approved

UDF Status



A new “inactive” status means that you don’t want to continue to have that on the list of UDFs for that object, But...

If data exists for it on previous records it will continue to show on those records.

Why is that helpful? Order UDFs especially seem to proliferate, but the question isn’t needed forever. This allows for you to use them while needed and then retire them while maintaining your data integrity.
